

he purpose of this study guide is to strengthen your memory of the Scriptural basis for the practice of tithing. This will also expand your *understanding* of the opportunity God has provided for each one of us to share in the "family business" as faithful stewards of our possessions and skills. Whatever work we do or career we follow can be dedicated to Christ through the practice of tithing.

Biblically guided *worship* is the most important practice for each of us. That regular practice of worship sets *truth* as the guiding standard of our lives. It clarifies our understanding. It sets priorities We have the benefit of not only receiving God's blessings, but we are also enabled to realize the worship aspect of our work when God is our priority.

Solomon said, "Money answers all things." This means money is the compensation for all kinds of work. It is also the medium of exchange for our purchases, investments, and gifts. Money can easily become a false god because of its usefulness and universal appeal. Thus, when we put God first financially, we are protecting ourselves from slipping into idolatry. We provide an *example* that blesses our family and friends. Hopefully, when you have completed this study, you will be enabled to assist others in understanding this awesome stewardship principle God has provided to bless us and make us to be "workers together with Him."

This study indicates every believer in Jesus Christ as Savior has a calling from God. You might not be called to be a pastor, but you are called to be a steward of the Gospel as well as steward of the abilities and possessions God has entrusted to you. At the end of this introduction, you will be invited to take an honest assessment of your abilities and possessions. This will be a preliminary list for your own use of what God has entrusted to you as one of His trustees. Your list is likely to expand as you continue your study, but it will always help you to recognize elements of your personal calling.

Your trusteeship is subject to expand as God brings forth His favor in your life. You have latent abilities that may not be visible to you now. Your ever-increasing trustworthiness may provide the Holy Spirit with occasions to increase your spiritual gifts. Walking with Christ is an exciting journey. Empowerment by the Holy Spirit is the great *enablement* regardless of circumstances. You are about to progress into an ever-more fulfilling life as a trusted and anointed "steward of the King." Opportunities for ministry are all around you. They often appear as problems or needs. You will minister from God's resources as well as from your own.

You will observe as you study the Scriptures and the text of *Prove God Now* that much of the language comes from the world of agriculture. All of us have some affinity for the language of the farm because we all love to eat. Therefore, the principles of farming are pertinent to everyone even in the spiritual elements of life. Most of us understand if the farmer fails in the task of food production, he will ultimately lose the land and the opportunity. That makes it serious business. However, if we fail in the spiritual arena by neglect or deliberate disobedience, the consequences are even more serious because they affect our eternity.

If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame." For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile— the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, for "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" (NIV).

If you have never prayed this prayer of confession and commitment to Christ, this would be an excellent time to do so. Have you prayed the prayer of agreement with God's call for you to be one of His "stewards," as is recorded on pages 162 and 163? This is a definite call for every believer. This would be a good time to pray that prayer too.

Now watch for opportunities to share with others the good news that you are a bornagain Christian and one of God's trustees. The Holy Spirit will prompt you each time an opportunity is available to share your story as one of the witnesses who knows Jesus personally. Enjoy the blessed life . . . it never ends.
